Executive Summary

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1) Introduction

Port Bonython Fuels Pty. Ltd. (PBF) has conducted Indigenous Heritage Surveys on land owned by the Minister for Infrastructure and licenced to Port Bonython Fuels Pty. Ltd. for the purpose of preliminary site survey and investigations.

The land location and survey boundaries are as set out in the Licence Agreement and PBF are proposing to develop a fuels terminal and refinery facility on the land.

2) Executive Summary

An Indigenous Heritage Survey has been conducted during the months of October, November and December of 2008. The survey activities were managed by PBF's consultant, Mr John Gleason and a report has been prepared. This report is confidential to the Survey Participants and PBF.

The report record may be summarised as follows:

2.1 Local indigenous community consultations were held with senior members of the Barngarla, Kokatha and Kuyani groups. The Nukunu group were also contacted but did not attend the site reviews.

2.2 The AARD were contacted seeking their confirmation that no heritage sites are recorded in the project area.

As at the date of this report no recorded or registered heritage sites have been notified on the surveyed (licenced) land.

2.3 An archaeological survey of the site was conducted by Mr Philip Hughes and Ms Marjorie Sullivan. Both desk top and on-site surveys were undertaken.

2.4 Summary of survey results

- No ethnographic sites were identified. Existing ethnographic values that have been identified are focused on the shoreline and not within the Licenced Land area.
- The consultations with the various indigenous groups would indicate that they are generally supportive of PBF's proposed development.
- The archaeological survey (Hughes and Sullivan) indicates there was no material identified within the Licenced Land area.
